

Patient Survey Findings

- More than 4 in 10 women would be very/extremely concerned about contracting COVID-19 were they to have a mammogram tomorrow at their usual facility.
- They would be most concerned about being in close proximity with others as well as being in a medical facility.
- Women are also more concerned about attending an exam at a hospital versus a standalone imaging center.








Patient Survey Findings

- However, over half of women nationally would ATTEND a scheduled mammography appointment in <u>May 2020</u>; but reassurances of safety would be required by over half of those attending.
- Nearly two-thirds of women are likely (very or quite) to attend a mammogram by august.
- If reassurances are provided, the 'back to scheduled mammogram' likelihood could shift and get to end-of-year levels in July.

Examples of Reassurances of Safety

Likelihood to have your next mammogram if facility offered this initiative (% Very Likely)

All staff certified Covid-19/Coronavirus tested and clear Changing room and mammography system deep clean after every exam Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for patients and staff Temperature check for every patient at check-in Reduced patient volume, guaranteeing no contact with another patient from reception check-in to departure A single-use hygiene pad that is applied on the breast tray Single-use sealed bag to hygienically store clothing and personal items during the exam Designated reduced-patient-volume days for older women and those with underlying health conditions Twice daily temperature check for staff Pre-appointment patient testing required and if positive, mammogram is canceled UV lighting check to maximize infection control Clearly marked signage and spaces to ensure social distancing rules are followed Physical barriers (e.g., temporary glass walls) between patients and staff Clearly marked signage at entrance and check-in about initiatives being taken to address Covid-19/Coronavirus during mammograms Information on website about all initiatives being taken to address Covid-19/Coronavirus during mammograms
